Marina Bay Sands ups the ante in annual charity festival

Sands for Singapore Charity Festival expands into 10day celebration as it rolls out first-ever charity race 'Play it Forward' and more

Singapore (18 June 2015) – From 31 July to 9 August, Marina Bay Sands will roll out its biggest-ever Sands for Singapore Festival in a 10-day celebration packed with fun-filled activities to raise funds for over 80 local charities.

The amped up Festival, held for the third consecutive year, intersects with the Golden Jubilee weekend and will feature the integrated resort's first-ever charity race *Play It Forward*.

The Festival will also see a record number of 25 community outreach events – including inviting members of the Pioneer Generation to watch The LKY musical for free – which is up from 18 events last year.

Marina Bay Sands Gives Back

To kick off the Festival, Marina Bay Sands will donate three days of proceeds from its popular attractions – the Sands SkyPark Observation Deck, ArtScience Museum, Sampan rides and Skating Rink – to Community Chest.

Racing for charity

Set to take place on 2 August, *Play It Forward* is a battle of wits and brawn, as teams race against time to complete different challenges taking place across Marina Bay Sands' iconic attractions such as ArtScience Museum and Sands SkyPark. Teams will tackle a myriad of tasks, quizzes and games to win S\$50,000 cash, which will be donated to the winning team's pre-selected charity. Participants can choose from the list of charities provided by Marina Bay Sands. (Annex A).



Play It Forward is open to members of the public aged 13 years and above, armed with tonnes of positive energy and the willingness to contribute a few hours on a Sunday morning to do their part for charity. Interested parties should form teams of six and share the reason why they should be chosen for this race. Marina Bay Sands is looking for up to 15 teams to participate. <u>Skills-based workshops and exclusive visits for beneficiaries</u>
Throughout the festival period, Sands for Singapore volunteers will host a slew of activities for beneficiaries. Hospitality students from schools such as the Mountbatten Vocational School and APSN Delta Senior and Katong schools, as well as the APSN Centre for Adults will gain hands-on experience in flower arrangement and table setting, conducted by Marina Bay Sands Housekeeping and Banquet teams.

Beneficiaries from AMKFSC Community Services and Metta School will enjoy guided tours and creative workshops at DreamWorks Animation: The Exhibition and The Deep at ArtScience Museum.

Together with The Red Pencil Singapore, the integrated resort's volunteers will also conduct a special art therapy workshop for 100 beneficiaries from the Movement for the Intellectually Disabled of Singapore (MINDS).

An exclusive evening for Singapore's Pioneer Generation

On 6 August, Marina Bay Sands will create a special experience for the Pioneer Generation and their families through invitations to attend The LKY Musical for free. More details will be released later.

Beneficiaries to experience National Day Parade (NDP) from 200m above ground 50 very special guests will also have the opportunity to view Singapore's biggest birthday bash on 1 August and 9 August together with Marina Bay Sands' volunteers. A section of the Sands SkyPark observation deck will be reserved for beneficiaries of a selected charity, for them to experience the NDP fireworks and catch the action of the Red Lions, the Fly Past and more, from 200 metres above ground.
