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Andy Warhol: 15 Minutes Eternal Exhibition extended at ArtScience Museum

Visitors to ArtScience Museum can also participate in art and educational programs that highlight Andy Warhol's creativity

"If you want to know all about Andy Warhol, just look at the surface of my paintings and films and me, and there I am. There's nothing behind it." Andy Warhol

Singapore (20 July 2012) – Originally slated to end its run on 12 August 2012, Andy Warhol: 15 Minutes Eternal exhibition, sponsored by BNY Mellon, has been extended for an additional 10 weeks until 21 October, as a result of overwhelming interest. Visitors who have not had the opportunity to visit the exhibition will now have their chance to do so.

From 20 July to 12 August, visitors will be able to participate in a series of workshops involving performance, photography and forums especially designed to complement the *Andy Warhol: 15 Minutes Eternal* exhibition experience.

To kick start the string of performances, <u>"Andy Warhol's Silver Clouds"</u> will be held from 20-22 July. Performer Susan Yeung, a Lasalle College of the Arts program coordinator and lecturer of the school of dance, will bring visitors to a whimsical world where she will interact, mold, and shape the gallery space. Her performance will take place within one of the gallery spaces in the exhibition area where silver balloons tumble and float around on the air currents. In 1968, a similar performance was done within Andy Warhol's factory where Merce Cunningham incorporated the *Silver Clouds* into a dance performance entitled "Rainforest."

On 2-5 August, <u>"Andy and Me"</u> will revolve around Andy Warhol's love for using technology to create art. This is the only four-session paid course (S\$150) among the workshops offered. Led by artist Ruthe Zuntz, the session will focus on the fun element in photo booth portrait taking where participants will learn, discover and experiment with the art of photography. Ruthe has been applying photography for the past 15 years as her primary medium in building narratives about everyday life.

<u>"A Star for 15 Minutes"</u>, choreographed by prominent Indonesian choreographer Eko Supriyanto, who is renowned for his ability to combine classical Javanese dance with both traditional folk and modern dance. He will perform a choreographic improvisation and fashion installation that was inspired from a film Andy Warhol made on Edi Sedgwick. The performance is set to take place within the exhibition galleries on 11 and 12 August.



Beyond the workshop and dance performances, ArtScience Museum will organize two discussions entitled *Museum Rendez-Vous* with Susan Yeung and Ruthe Zuntz on 22 and 28 July respectively. These forums aim to engage audiences in a dialogue reflecting the connection between Art and Science. Both Susan Yeung and Ruthe Zuntz will share their experiences and thoughts with the audience. In addition, a special dialogue has been arranged with the exhibition designer (Yann Follain), a French artist (Gilles Massot), a Malaysian filmmaker and photographer (Sherman Ong) and Turkish artist (Ardan Ozmenoglu), all of whom will share their insights into the Andy Warhol exhibition.

Andy Warhol created numerous masterpieces using the silkscreen printing technique, and visitors to the exhibition will also get the opportunity to try out silkscreen printing. Visitors will also get to keep their own silkscreen painting at the end of the workshop.

Mr. Nick Dixon, Executive Director, ArtScience Museum at Marina Bay Sands, said, "Andy Warhol: 15 Minutes Eternal will show visitors the multiple facets of Andy's talents. Our goal is to not only show his creativity, but also the processes that were used to create the iconic and memorable artworks.
