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MARINA BAY SANDS SUPPORTS NINE LOCAL ARTS GROUPS THROUGH THE SANDS INNOVATIVE ARTS FUND

Now in its second year, the Fund continues its mission of supporting emerging arts organisations in their innovative artmaking and creative community outreach to reach new audiences



Marina Bay Sands has been a strong supporter of the arts since its opening in 2010, championing the creative spirit and providing a platform for artistic works to be accessible by a wider audience

Singapore (5 August 2025) — Seven Singaporean arts groups have successfully presented impactful programmes for the community through the first year of the Sands Innovative Arts Fund, a S\$500,000 donation by Marina Bay Sands established under the National Arts Council (NAC)'s Sustain the Arts (stART) Fund.

Now in its second year, the Sands Innovative Arts Fund will be supporting two new grantees, lifting to nine the number of local arts groups receiving support to date. These are Lirica Arts, which actively collaborates with under-represented communities to create an authentic immersive experience blending digital technology with traditional theatre, making Western vocal classic music accessible to all, and the Singapore Indian Orchestra and Choir, which is planning to develop a digital documentary to commemorate its 40th anniversary of promoting rich Indian musical forms infused with Singapore's multicultural identity in this SG60 year.

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Introduced in January 2024, the Sands Innovative Arts Fund invests in the future of emerging art forms and innovative creators, propelling their growth and expansion of programmes to inspire communities creatively, strengthen societal bonds between generations, and foster Singapore's unique cultural identity.

In addition to the two new grantees, the Sands Innovative Arts Fund will be providing additional support to two first-batch grantees – inwardBOUND to extend its outreach to both youth and seniors through sustained intergenerational storytelling, and Pasat Merdu to promote intercultural music practices across the region.

inwardBOUND expanded re:ACT, its community theatre arm through the re:ACT Festival: Intergenerational Issues in Singapore. The Festival aims to foster empathy, dialogue and deeper community connection between seniors and youth by encouraging both generations to engage with social issues through theatre. As a second-year grantee, inwardBOUND will continue to expand its impact through theatre and digital media—preserving seniors' voices and contributing to Singapore's collective cultural memory. Pasat Merdu premiered the works of aspiring Singaporean composers at a live performance at Stamford Arts Centre on 26 July. These composers are part of the New Sights Fellowship Programme—an initiative that supports them in pursuing their artistic visions by fostering relationships with cultural music traditions, communities, and diverse voices. Through mentorship, workshops, and collaborations with cultural bearers and renowned artists, the fellows contribute meaningfully to Singapore's growing canon of musical works. Looking

Highlights from the first-year recipients

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The first-year recipients spanned a wide spectrum of arts forms, from performances to foster intercultural music and showcase the vibrant diversity of musical communities in Singapore, to leveraging interactive theatre to address social issues and bridge the youth and elderly communities.

They are:

- (1) **Brahmastra**, a multi-ethnic youth ensemble passionate about music that transcends genres and generations;
- (2) Chinese Opera Studio, a Teochew opera troupe which focuses on promoting Singapore's traditional cultural and value through cross-training local Teochew musicians to organise a live music show;
- (3) **inwardBOUND**, a Singapore-based drama education company that empowers youth through applied theatre and creative expression;
- (4) Orchestra of the Music Makers (OMM), a symphony orchestra that aims to pique young people's interest in orchestral music;
- (5) Pasat Merdu, a non-profit orchestral ensemble focused on fostering intercultural understanding and uncovering the essence of the Singaporean Sound through education, commissions, presentations and promotion of new works;
- (6) **Polarity,** a dance company that pushes the boundaries of Street Dance, through conversation, collaboration and platforms; and
- (7) **Reverberance**, an award-winning Chinese wind-percussion ensemble comprising youthful local musicians with a passion for developing music and connecting with diverse audiences from all walks of life, including seniors.

Members of the public are welcome to show their support for the local arts by attending and participating in the various arts offerings that will be showcased from now till the end of the year.

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Due to popular demand after its sold-out premiere in April, **Reverberance** will be restaging its original musical *Journey to Singapura* at Gateway Theatre this October. A creative reimagining of Journey to the West, the story is written and directed by Garrick Wong where it takes audiences on a meaningful journey through Singapore's history, from its humble beginnings to its emergence as a vibrant, modern nation. Presented as a special SG60 tribute, this restaging promises new songs, refined choreography, and an even more engaging narrative. At its heart, *Journey to Singapura* aims to celebrate local heritage and preserve the unique art of Chinese wind percussion. Follow their Instagram @reverberance sg for more details.

On 29 November, Chinese Opera Studio will be bringing its Opera show titled "四告状" to Our Tampines Hub's Festive Arts Theatre. Typically, opera music is pre-recorded in China due to lower costs and higher standards. However, the support from the Sands Innovative Arts Fund has made it possible to organise a year-long cross-training programme for local Singapore Teochew musicians to present Teochew opera music in a digitised format. Meanwhile, OMM will be organising a workshop in August for underprivileged upper primary and lower secondary students. The workshop will introduce them to different orchestral instruments, along with a curated orchestral performance featuring a new work by Singaporean composer Gu Wei. In December, young musicians across the island will gather for a seven-day Orchestra Camp at the School of the Arts. They will explore symphonic repertoires with guidance from OMM's conductors and professional orchestral performers, culminating in a concert on 13 December. This concert also spotlights three Singaporean musicians: composer Sandra Lim, as well as soloists Joelle Hsu and Chua Jay Roon.
