Singapore (30 March 2022) – Throughout April, visitors at ArtScience Museum will have the chance to experience what it is like on board Spaceship Earth and stand to win attractive prizes as they imagine a world created by 20th century inventor Buckminster Fuller. The programme will also include a series of online lectures, supplementing *Radical Curiosity: In the Orbit of Buckminster Fuller*, that consider the legacy of Fuller.

Radical Curiosity: Be a Crew Member on Spaceship Earth Contest

"We are all astronauts on a little spaceship called Earth." - Buckminster Fuller

In conjunction with ongoing exhibition, *Radical Curiosity*, ArtScience Museum is paging Bucky enthusiasts to take part in its *Be a Crew Member on Spaceship Earth* Contest this April.

Fuller coined the term "Spaceship Earth" to describe the world, as he sought to better understand and guide this unique vessel on which everyone is a passenger. He believed that just like the crew of a large ship, people could be comprehensively successful in maintaining a functioning, healthy planet when they work together and use their ingenuity to the best of their abilities.

In an initiative that will run till 30 April 2022, ArtScience Museum's *Be a Crew Member on Spaceship Earth* Contest seeks to explore what visitors think the future of "Spaceship Earth" will look like and how they can contribute to its improvement. Participants are invited to upload a public post of their drawings, sculptures, or videos explaining their ideas, on either Facebook or Instagram, alongside the hashtag #ASMSpaceshipEarth.

The grand prize is a 2D1N staycation at Marina Bay Sands (worth S\$660) and a membership to the ArtScience Friends Group (worth S\$298).

Additionally, a series of online lectures exploring Fuller's legacy accompanies *Radical Curiosity*. The exhibition curators Rosa Pera and José Luis de Vicente are set to present the inaugural lecture where they will discuss the universe of Fuller, who, throughout the 20th century, foresaw the looming crises of the 21st century.

During the session, Pera and de Vicente will also share their insights on how *Radical Curiosity* came into being, Fuller's extensive influence on contemporary visions of the future, and the ways in which his ideas are still influential today.

There will also be talks by luminaries such as Charu Kokate (Partner and Director of Safdie Architects Singapore) and Datuk Seri Lim Chong Keat in the series, which will be uploaded on ArtScience Museum's YouTube playlist here.

Time to Talk aims to raise public awareness of mental health topics while encouraging people to share their personal experiences.
