LASALLE students create art works influenced by Andy Warhol and ArtScience

ArtScience Museum to display winning art pieces as part of LASALLE@ARTSCIENCEMUSEUM partnership

Singapore (24 April 2012) – Four talented students from LASALLE College of arts; *Uni Lee* (26), *Khadija Khalid* (23), *Hogai Wee* (30) and *Marcus Yuen* (24) have won the opportunity of a lifetime to display their creations alongside the famous art pieces of iconic pop artist Andy Warhol at ArtScience Museum at Marina Bay Sands.

As part of the year-long partnership with LASALLE College of the Arts, ArtScience Museum at Marina Bay Sands organized a competition based on Andy Warhol's influence on modern day art for young artists. Students were challenged to create original pieces using any medium on the theme "*If Andy Warhol was alive now in Singapore, what would he be doing on the topic of ArtScience?*"

The winning entry – selected from 36 art project proposals – was titled "*Family Portrait*" which is an interactive installation using photography and projection as a core medium. The installation reflects the first world dilemma of the physical relationship of human beings slowly fading due to the advent of technology – an idea that is evocative of Warhol's penchant for speaking the truth about modern society.

The competition, organised from November 2011 to March 2012, encouraged the students to experiment with any topics or professions that sparked imagination and inspiration. The student's creativeness resulted in pieces of art that utilized artistic mediums ranging from print to paint and the use of digital mediums such as cameras, computers and even to fashion design.

Mr. Nick Dixon, Executive Director, ArtScience Museum at Marina Bay Sands, said "ArtScience Museum is a place where we explore the creative processes that lie at the heart of the arts and sciences. We encourage our visitors to be inspired and explore their own creativity. As we developed the Warhol exhibition, we involved LASALLE College of the Arts' students in a proactive manner. This engagement invited students to learn about the different creative processes of the exhibitions and understand the mechanics behind each art work. This meeting of the minds was made possible because Andy Warhol was such an iconic Pop Artist. The students art works were created through experimentation using a wide spectrum of topics and mediums The challenge presented to the students was to create something that Andy would be proud of and push the boundaries of art and merge it with science."



The winning entry, which was selected from a shortlisted list of three finalists, was picked by a jury that consisted of:

Adds Mr. Eric Shiner, Director of The Andy Warhol Museum, "When I was invited to be on the jury for this competition, I knew I had to be part of this, as the competition's idea of using ArtScience as a theme was very original and in keeping with Andy Warhol's ideology. I wanted to see what the students from LaSalle were capable of creating. After reviewing all the entries, I must say there were a lot that would have made Andy Warhol very proud of their works."

Says Jane Cameron Allan, Dean of the Faculty for the Creative Industries, LASALLE College of the Arts, "The partnership with ArtScience Museum has involved LASALLE students in the day to day life of the museum in ways that were quite unforeseen when Senior Project Manager, ArtScience Museum, Lise Macdonald and I first started talking in August 2011. The partnership has initially seen the installation of the LASALLE kinetic Christmas tree, and now we have this incredible opportunity to be part of a highly professional and structured run-up for the Andy Warhol competition. The selection process gave participating students an invaluable insight into the demands of such a prestigious competition. The three finalists' works are remarkable for their individual differences and their truly contemporary character, yet any visitor to the Warhol show will be able to trace the influences."

This partnership, called LASALLE@ARTSCIENCEMUSEUM, will continue to engage students and lecturers from LASALLE in talks, workshops, and other forms of creative exchanges held at the ArtScience Museum.

Simultaneous to the year long partnership with LASALLE, ArtScience Museum has been actively engaging various schools and universities to provide a public platform for workshops and performances. Schools involved to date include; Huamin Primary School, Maris Stella High School, Holy Innocents High School, Pioneer Junior College, and National University of Singapore.
