Marina Bay Sands Fun Facts

- Marina Bay Sands' 2,561 room hotel is the largest hotel in Singapore, the 6th largest in Asia and the 34th largest in the world. With Marina Bay Sands, Singapore has entered into the "World's 100 Largest Hotels" list.
- The three iconic towers are among the most complex buildings ever built. Each tower has sloping as well as straight legs. In Hotel Tower 1 – where the slope is as steep as 26 degrees - both legs are connected at Level 23 to form a single building.
- Marina Bay Sands built one new hotel floor every 4 days, the fastest pace ever for a development of this scale in Singapore.
- It takes the average person 20 minutes to climb up the 55 floors of the hotel towers.
- Marina Bay Sands opened on 27 April 2010 and has welcomed 31 million visitors in 2011 and 38.5 million visitors in 2012
- The two, very exclusive Chairman Suites are 629 square metres each - equivalent to the size of over 2 tennis courts - yielding the largest suites in Singapore.
- Marina Bay Sands casino is lit up by a 7.1 tonnes chandelier made with 132,000 Swarovski crystals, making it one of the world's largest chandeliers.
- One of the commissioned art pieces, the *Rain Oculus* by Ned Kahn (located on the Event Plaza) has 6,000 gallons of water flowing per minute.
- More than 200,000 people watched WICKED and the production played to standing ovations since it opened in December 2011 with 160 performances over 20 weeks.
- Over 286,000 people have visited *Titanic: the Artifact Exhibition* during its six month run at the ArtScience Museum at Marina Bay Sands, making this the most well attended museum exhibition in Singapore.
- Marina Bay Sands uses approximately 36,000 key cards a month. Lining them up will be as long as 306km – the distance of more than 7 full marathons.
- On a typical day, team members consume 200 kg of rice, 1,200 kg protein/meat and 1,500 kg of veggies in the Team Member Dining Room. This is equivalent to the weight of a female Asian elephant.
- The wardrobe department has gone through 500 different uniform designs since opening.

Sands SkyPark

- The lifting of the Sands SkyPark was one of the most complex and challenging phases in the construction of Marina Bay Sands. Over 7,000 tonnes of steel were pre-assembled at ground level into 14 individual pieces. Each piece was hoisted 200 metres using strand jacks more commonly used in bridge construction and each lift required 24 hours. It is among the highest strand jacking operations ever undertaken on a building anywhere in the world.
- The Sands SkyPark, which offers a Public Observation Deck, lush gardens, an infinity pool and 3 restaurants/clubs, is on the 57th floor, 200-metres above ground.
- The 12,400 square metres Sands SkyPark is longer than the Eiffel Tower is tall and large enough to park four-and-a-half A380 jumbo jets.
- The Sands SkyPark is home to the world's largest elevated swimming pool (150 metres long), which holds 376,000 gallons of water –that's almost one and half million litres! If you drink one gallon a day (twice the "required" 64 ounces daily) from birth and lived to the ripe old age of 100, it would take you ten lifetimes to finish the entire pool.
- The Sands SkyPark is home to 250 trees and 650 plants.

Crystal Pavilions

- The Marina Bay Sands Crystal Pavilions are the largest commercial floating structures to be built in the heart of Singapore.

- The initial construction work on the cofferdams^[1] began in September 2009. The installation of the steel and glass structure above water levels began in April 2010.
- The Southern Crystal Pavilion foundation is at its deepest at approximately 62-metres from the surface of the water while the Northern Crystal Pavilion is about 48-metres below the surface of Marina Bay.
- Approximately 650-tonnes of structural and architectural steel were used in the construction of each pavilion.
- 671 double glazed glass panel units were installed in the Northern Crystal Pavilion, while 532 panels were used in the Southern Crystal Pavilion. These glass panels were specially manufactured to suit the non-standard geometry of the pavilion façades.
- The highest point of the glass roof of each crystal pavilion is at least 17-metres or nearly 6-stories above the water surface.
- The tunnels connecting the Southern and Northern pavilions to the main Marina Bay Sands building are over 30-metres long.

ArtScience Museum

- 5,200 tonnes of steel were used to construct the ArtScience Museum.
- 12,500 square metres of Glass Fiber Reinforced polymer (GFRP), a material more commonly used in boats and surf boards, was used for the overall cladding of the ArtScience Museum.
- The cladding process took abseilers 4 months to complete.
- The ArtScience Museum has 10 “fingers” of varying height and width, known as radial trusses.
- Longest Truss extends towards the sky at 45 metres.
- Shortest Truss extends towards the sky at 23 metres.
