MARINA BAY SANDS HOTEL

Since its opening in 2010, Marina Bay Sands has reshaped Singapore's skyline with its iconic architecture and distinctive guest experiences. Comprising three towers crowned by the Sands SkyPark, the hotel has become a global landmark, renowned for its distinctive architecture, diverse offerings, and exemplary service.

At a Glance

- Marina Bay Sands is Singapore's largest hotel, comprising approximately 1,850 rooms and suites across 55 floors, including 775 suites spanning three towers. Every room offers panoramic views of either the South China Sea or Marina Bay and the city skyline.
- The integrated resort's ongoing US\$1.75 billion reinvestment programme marks its most significant transformation to date, setting a new benchmark in luxury hospitality with the introduction of The Sands Collection and The Paiza Collection since 2021.
- The Sands Collection elevates luxury hospitality with a refined home-away-from-home ambience, offering a diverse range of room types—from the Sands Premier Room with its reimagined Armoire minibar and Cocktail Trolley to the family-friendly Sands Family Suite—designed to meet varied guest needs.
- The rooms and suites of The Paiza Collection epitomise timeless luxury, occupying the highest floors of the landmark property and offering a refined residential experience akin to an exclusive penthouse. The collection includes the Horizon Suite, a dedicated spa and wellness retreat; the Presidential Suite with an in-room golf simulator; and the Chairman Suite, a palatial three- or four-bedroom residence designed for elegant entertaining.
- In February 2026, The Paiza Collection earned the prestigious Forbes Travel Guide Five-Star Rating for the second consecutive year.
- The array of dining experiences at the hotel include:
 - *RISE*, an international buffet restaurant offering breakfast, lunch and dinner.
 - *The Club*, the hotel's lobby lounge serving an all-day à la carte menu and an afternoon tea menu.
 - *Origin + Bloom*, a European-inspired patisserie concept offering a diverse array of artisanal bakes, gourmet sandwiches and coffee.
 - *WAKUDA*, a Japanese restaurant created by Michelin-starred chef Tetsuya Wakuda and award-winning restaurateur John Kunkel of 50 Eggs Hospitality Group.

- *Blossom*, a fine-dining Chinese restaurant.
- 24-hour In-Room Dining, which offers an extensive menu selection.

Design Highlights

- The hotel has sloping towers and straight legs connected at Level 23 to form a single building.
- In Tower 1, the slope is as steep as 26 degrees, making it one of the most complex hotels ever built.
- During its construction phase, Marina Bay Sands built one new hotel floor every four days, the fastest pace ever for a development of this scale in Singapore.

The Best Views of Singapore – Sands SkyPark

Sands SkyPark is an architectural masterpiece sitting on top of the three hotel towers at Marina Bay Sands. This 1.2-hectare tropical oasis is longer than the Eiffel Tower and is tall and large enough to park four-and-a-half A380 jumbo jets. It extends to form one of the world’s longest public cantilevers.

Facts about the Sands SkyPark:

- Built at the height of 200 metres.
- Its lush, landscaped gardens are home to more than 700 trees and palms.
- Offers a total of 12,400 square metres of space—big enough to fit three football fields.
- A ticketed public observation deck that can host hundreds of people.
- Hotel guests have the exclusive use of a 150-metre infinity swimming pool, the world’s largest outdoor pool at that height.
- A comprehensive daily wellness programme - *Where Mind & Body Connect* - is held at SkyPark Observation Deck for both hotel and public guests.

- Acclaimed restaurants include Spago by Wolfgang Puck, located at Tower 2, which offers Californian cuisine with global accents.
- LAVO Italian Restaurant & Rooftop Bar perches atop Tower 1, complete with a wraparound outdoor terrace, a luxurious lounge, and exciting nightlife programming including live DJ sets.
- On the other end sits *CÉ LA VI*, featuring the alfresco SkyBar & Club Lounge as well as a restaurant serving contemporary Asian cuisine.
